Overview

The summary information below describes inmates under the custody of the Wisconsin Department of Corrections on December 31, 2013 who only have active sentences for offense(s) committed on or before December 31, 1999 = 2,887.

Summary:

- 98% of the population is male
- 52% identify themselves as White; 45% Black
- 64% were under the age of 30 at the time of at least one their crime(s)
- 77% are over 40 years old
- 61% are medium custody
- 95% are serving a sentence for a violent crime
- 71% have five years or more left to serve in prison (26% are serving a life sentence)
- 38% have an active sex offense
- 70% do not have a mental health condition







Custody Level












Releases 2000-2012

Notes

- *Each individual sentence structure will determine parole eligibility*
- *Inmates with a sentence term of 15 months or less have the possibility of being New Law are excluded*
- *Excludes sentences and sentence history from other states*
- *Excludes probation and parole holds, Temp Holds, County Holds, Alternative to Revocations, Pending Admissions, Inmates serving another state's sentence who are in a WI DOC facility, and inmates currently in escape status*
- *Excludes inmates who have missing offense and sentence dates*
- *Association of State Correctional Administrators (ASCA) as part of its Performance Based Measures System (PBMS). The PBMS was developed to establish correctional standards across states and to allow for the appropriate comparisons of performance measures across jurisdictions.*
